CED 2018-19

The main aim of the CED programme is to document information relating to social change and development such that they are accessible to ordinary people in order to enable and empower them to participate in their development and governance. While the daily newspaper can be considered the main source of accessible information on contemporary information, the digital media and google type search engines deliver whatever print and visual information one asks for. Still the method of googled mediation may not really be liberative in so far as it is governed by commerce friendly algorithms. Given the current context of search engines, and websites like Wikipedia, Counter Currents, as well as the various Blogs, CED old methods of curation & organisation of information has however been rendered uneconomical. At the same time a challenge is thrown up, as content is now created, mediated and consumed by ordinary people be it as posts, forwards, comments, as well as plain hyperlinks. The challenge is to aggregate such relevant content as well as create an eco-system where experiential knowledge, oral histories, actions and reflections of activist, artist, young change makers is curated, slowed down and acted upon. Thus a case is made out for CED to enable and promote a more conscious digital citizenship and participation.

To this end, CED has decided to de-emphasise its physical knowledge resources, and engage with digital information politics, development and social change. In this year we have negotiated with Asim Premji University to take over and maintain our documentation and library resources, most of which they will also digitise, to increase accessibility. On the other hand we have created an Interactive space at CED Mumbai in collaboration with BRM. Further by engaging with key social change organisations and networks like PUCL, CFP, INECC, CED will capture ongoing information and knowledge with such social practitioners, and make them digitally available for research and education in the form of video, electronic databases, and webpages.. however now they will focus on current issues that these frontline groups are engaged in like Civil Liberties, Alternative Economics, Climate Change, Social Change etc.

The main engagement this year has been with youth. This has been done through collaboration with the BRM and other youth networks, and to enable proper documentation of this experience, CED has partnered with BRM to create the CED-BRM Media Labs. Given the political space, and circumstances of the NGO funding scenario, CED has been trying to develop a post-project-funding eco-system, which is still in a nascent conceptual stage.

In addition to the Media Labs, CED ongoing programme of Long & Winding Road, and Transmedia proactive documentation involves

Media Labs

As a pathway towards developing slow knowledge and documentation, CED developed Media Labs. Implemented in partnership with BRM (Blue Ribbon Movement, CED BRM Media Labs is a space to enable young people to critically reflect on their own media consumption and its shaping influence, collaborate and create their own understanding of realities around them and own their voice and create independent media. It is a space to empower youth with tools such that they can go beyond the passive DIY shortcuts in media production and create new socially relevant content, develop active social engagement component in addition getting formally trained in media and documentation.

The first two batches of Media Labs, were held between August 2018 and January 2019. Each fellow was tasked with preparing one video and engage in several exercises during the various workshops and Seminars held during this period.

Organisational Aspects:

The Management of CED is the responsibility of the Executive Council. The current members of Anjum Rajabali, Rajni Bakshi, Walter Mendoza, John Dsouza, Preeti Bhat, Leena Abraham. The trust matters are the responsibility of the trustees: who are: Anjum Rajabali, Rajni Bakshi, Walter Mendoza and John D'Souza. Four Meetings of the Executive has been held during 2018-19. The following are the General Body members. Anjum Rajabali, Rajni Bakshi, Walter Mendoza, John D'Souza, Sumi Krishna, Kaiwan Mehta, Karuna D'Souza, Leena Abraham, Preeti Bhat, Abhishek Bharadwaj, Amita Malkani, Tanvi Patel, Tanya Goveas.

Staffing has been restricted due to the lack of funds, partly because activities like those of CED are not priotised by donor agencies, if they are independent and autonomous of other funded activities. Currently Praful Sawal is the lone full time regular staffer. Rajshekara M our retired office assistant in Bangalore comes into CED Bangalore office as and when required for cleaning, as well as user visits to library, and is paid on a prorata basis. Similarly Priya Pradeep and Jacintha Menezes put in e-work from home, as and when required. All other work is done through specific contract and payments are increasingly linked to deliverables. Thus John D'Souza works on a part-time basis against reporting of work done and delivered. Vinod Kumar has been voluntering to handled some of the emergent matters relating to the servers and websites. BRM volunteers particularly Arnaz Khan and Kejal Savla helped out with organising several events and recordings especially Media Labs. Rajni Bakshi and Walter Mendoza have volunteered and organised some of the events and documentation on peace and climate change respectively.

Looking Forward

Looking forward, CED would like to take the MediaLabs effort forward, with an Evening Unschool of Information, Education and Communication. The main task of the Unschool would be to create Development Information Content of Social Change, with focus on Youth. The Unschool will be centered around Youth Action and Civil Society engagement. BRM as the main partners in this endeavour, is also keen on developing its communication and knowledge to project its work particularly in Community Connect, Multi-varsities, Gender Labs, Rurban (Rural -Urban social change)and Media Labs.

The Unschool will work four days a week, from 5.30 to 8.30, as an open lab on IEC. It will hold lectures, workshops, seminars, as also skills development programmes on media, documentation, research. On most days, there is no pre-decided workshop/lecture etc. Those who come will take up any learning, experiments, from a menu of things and course materials that will be made available. The Unschool will also organise field trips to NGOs, and provide opportunities for documentation, research, and action. Practical media production and research will be joint learning projects. Some of these projects will also be earning opportunities. The fellows will be affiliated for periods of six months, and certification will be based on journalled description of work done, and actual performance assessed by a viva voce on outputs and impacts of work done. Faculty will be drawn from senior and professionals in CED, BRM. Swaraj University and Vikalp Sangam.

All research/media will be valourised into the Documentation System as additions to its database, oral history projects, video documentation, websites/webpages and other transmedia and educational outputs. This is basically our documentation of different issues, videos, lectures etc. and they will be encourage to make a) webpages based on this documentation, and b) social media posts giving their understanding of some of these. and c) hold a discussion leading to a blog or post on any social topic.



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
